

What is Weatherization?

The Department of Energy’s Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) is the nation’s core program for delivering energy efficiency services to low-income households. The program’s goal is to reduce energy costs to low-income persons by improving the energy efficiency of their homes while ensuring their health and safety. Nationwide, weatherization benefits low-income households and communities and generates an average energy cost savings of \$300 per home each year. Professionally trained weatherization crews perform on-site home energy audits using state of the art equipment to identify outside drafts and inspect heating and cooling systems for efficiency. Weatherization crews install insulation, seal off air leaks, make modifications to (or replace) existing heating systems, and make minor repairs to ensure safety. Once installed, these energy saving measures help to reduce heating and cooling costs for years to come.

Who Provides the Weatherization Services?

Community Action Agencies across the state provide weatherization as well as an array of other services in all 77 Oklahoma Counties. The Community Action Agency that serves your county is listed in the Chart to the Right.

Do I qualify for services?

WAP has income eligibility requirements. If you and/or family members receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments for the Aged, Blind or Disabled, or cash assistance payments under Title IV (Grants to States for Aid and Services to needy Families with children and for Child Welfare Services) you are automatically eligible.

You may also be eligible for assistance if your income meets the federally established income guidelines shown in the chart below. You don’t have to own your own home to qualify. You may qualify whether you own or rent, live in a single-family home, multifamily housing or in a mobile home.

Is preference given to certain groups?

Even if you do qualify, please be aware preference for services is given to the very low income, persons over 60, persons with disabilities and families with small children.

How do I apply?

Easy low-cost and no-cost ways to save energy Today.

- Install a programmable thermostat.
- Use compact fluorescent light bulbs with the ENERGY STAR® label.
- Air dry dishes instead of using your dishwasher's drying cycle.
- Turn off your computer and monitor when not in use.
- Plug home electronics, such as TVs and DVD players, into power strips; turn the power strips off when the equipment is not in use (TVs and DVDs in standby mode still use several watts of power).
- Lower the thermostat on your hot water heater to 120°F.
- Take short showers instead of baths.
- Wash only full loads of dishes and clothes.
- Drive sensibly. Aggressive driving (speeding, rapid acceleration and braking) wastes gasoline.
- Look for the ENERGY STAR label on home appliances and products. ENERGY STAR products meet strict efficiency guidelines set by the U.S. Department of Energy and the Environmental Protection Agency.
